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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2023

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2023 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A and Series LB securities returned -7.7% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 0.9% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned 2.9%), and a 50% weighting in the Bloomberg MSCI Green Bond (Hedged) Index (returned -1.2%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equities rose over the period as central banks slowed the pace of their interest rate increases. The global economy proved resilient, and employment remained strong. With high inflation persisting, the U.S. Federal Reserve, European Central Bank and Bank of England raised their policy rates, albeit at a slower pace. In response, global fixed income yields moved higher, while bond prices fell. Global corporate bond prices declined but outperformed government bonds, with credit spreads (the difference in yield between corporate and government bonds) narrowing.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Hungary, Egypt and Turkey were the strongest-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while Hong Kong, New Zealand and Finland were the weakest. The energy, information technology and communication services sectors were the strongest performers, while utilities, real estate and consumer staples were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income securities, which underperformed equities in the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund underperformed the blended index, with stock selection in the information technology sector within the equity portfolio detracting from performance.

Within the equity portfolio, stock selection in the United States, Germany and China detracted from performance, as did an overweight position and stock selection in France. In sector terms, stock selection in industrials and materials also detracted from performance, as did overweight exposure to utilities. Conversely, an overweight position and stock selection in Brazil contributed to performance. In sector terms, lack of exposure to health care contributed to performance.

Within the fixed income portfolio, overweight exposure to provincial bonds and security selection among corporate bonds in the real estate sector detracted from performance. Conversely, security selection among corporate bonds in the financial sector contributed to performance.

Unhedged foreign currency exposure in the fixed income portfolio detracted from performance as a result of the overall depreciation of the unhedged currencies relative to the Canadian dollar.

Over the period, the Fund's cash position decreased as the fixed income portfolio management team found opportunities within foreign government bonds, in particular long-term U.S. Treasuries, amid rising interest rates. The Fund's exposure to fixed income and to the United States increased.

Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Impact

The equity portfolio management team has identified a growing opportunity for environmentally focused investment in large global and integrated utility companies. For that reason, the Fund has holdings in companies whose activities range from renewable energy development to transmission and distribution. Given increasing investments in clean energy relative to fossil fuels globally, the team believes diversified utility companies that invest a significant portion of their capital expenditures in renewable projects are positioned to pursue robust development pathways.

During the period, the team added a position in Carrier Global Corp. to the portfolio. Carrier is an American multinational company that manufactures heating, cooling and energy-efficient appliances, and is one of the global leaders in heat pump production. In the coming decades, heat pumps are expected to greatly increase their market share of appliances to serve the energy needs of homes. Because most heat pumps are powered by electricity, they produce fewer carbon emissions than appliances using fossil fuels. Utilizing a heat pump, rather than a traditional oil- or gas-fired furnace and/or air conditioning unit, can also boost the energy efficiency of the average home significantly. Energy efficiency is the one of the team's six primary areas of environmental focus.

The team also added a position in Centrais Elétricas Brasileiras SA – Eletrobras, which is one of the largest utility companies in South America. Eletrobras generates over half of Brazil's electricity supply, almost entirely from hydropower, and operates a significant portion of the country's transmission network. Its operations facilitate not only the effective and efficient transportation of electricity but also the adoption of renewable energy.

The fixed income portfolio management team considers a variety of factors when looking to invest in ESG-labelled debt, which generally falls into four main buckets: green bonds, social bonds, sustainable bonds and sustainability-linked bonds. These factors include:

- the ability to link the impact of a project to a specific bond;
- the issuer's detailed description of funded projects and annual performance updates;
- the issuer's use of an "impact calculation" based on evident and clear methodology;
- allocation or "use of proceeds" reporting that meets the team's standards; and
- the bond's alignment with various United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

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A significant addition to the fixed income portfolio over the period was the Galapagos Debt for Nature Swap blue bond, issued by Ecuador and the Inter-American Development Bank (GPS Blue Financing DAC, 5.65%, 11-09-2041). Beyond the financial considerations, this bond offers the unique bonus of providing desperately needed capital for marine conservation efforts in one of the world's most biodiverse regions. Annually, the bond is expected to double the conservation funding available within the region, while committing to improved sustainable fishing regulations and reporting in the nationally protected Hermandad Marine Reserve.

Over the period, the portfolio significantly increased its position in the inaugural green bond from the Government of New Zealand (4.25%, 05-15-2034), which will finance transition themes such as clean transport, energy efficiency, renewable energy, green buildings, living and natural resources, and land use. The country's Green Bond Framework supports the continued financing of the environmental objectives highlighted in New Zealand's 2022–2025 Emission Reduction Plan. Further, the framework highlights the importance of an intersectional approach to sustainability, emphasizing the role of traditional Maori (Indigenous) philosophies and leadership in the country's environmental and economic transition to net zero. New Zealand is a leader in ESG factors according to the team's sovereign sustainability models.

As higher-quality ESG-labelled debt was issued over the period, the team gradually moved more of the fixed income portfolio into these types of debt securities. Green bonds increased to 65% of the portfolio's fixed income investments from 48%, while exposure to sustainable bonds decreased to 9% from 14%, sustainability-linked bonds decreased to 2% from 9%, and social bonds decreased to 0% from 1%.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 15.7% during the period to \$168.7 million. This change was composed primarily of \$12.8 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$35.7 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2023, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2023. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The wind power industry experienced significant economic challenges over the period, particularly offshore. As the price of polysilicon decreased and Chinese competition increased, the equity portfolio management team positioned the portfolio to favour solar over wind power. The team believes the energy transition requires a viable Chinese solar supply, and continues to find Chinese producers relatively attractively valued. The team takes a value-oriented approach to investing in companies that are positively exposed to the energy transition, in the belief that renewable energy, energy efficiency and other environmentally focused sectors are poised to benefit from growth.

The fixed income portfolio management team expects interest rates to remain at elevated levels for longer than initially expected and economic growth to slow because of the impact of earlier central bank rate increases. At the end of the period, inflation in the United States was easing but remained high. The team is cautious about prospects for high-yield bonds as economic uncertainty challenges credit fundamentals amid tighter spreads. The team believes issuer selection and sound credit research remain important in assessing investment opportunities. These criteria are part of the portfolio's ESG investment strategy.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

At September 30, 2023, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.2 million in the Fund (0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

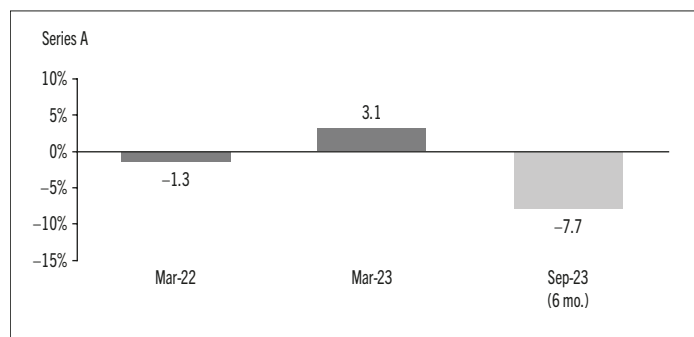
Past Performance

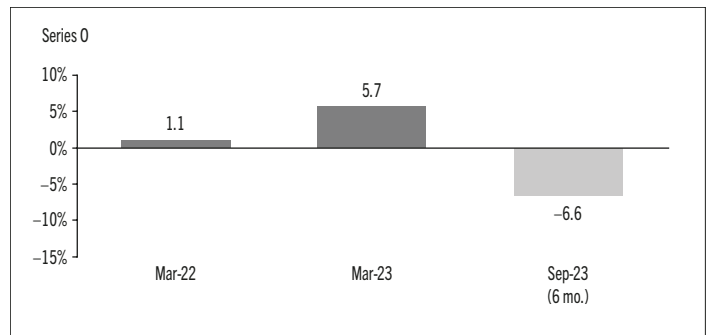
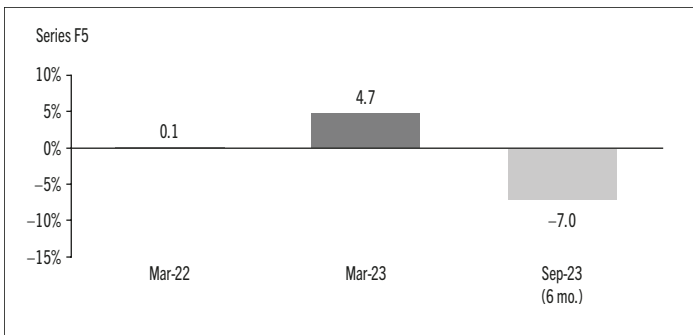
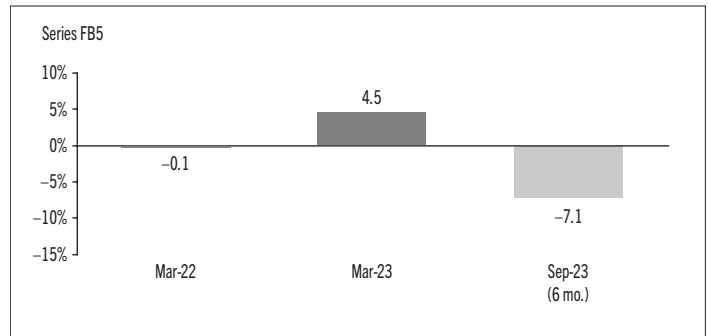
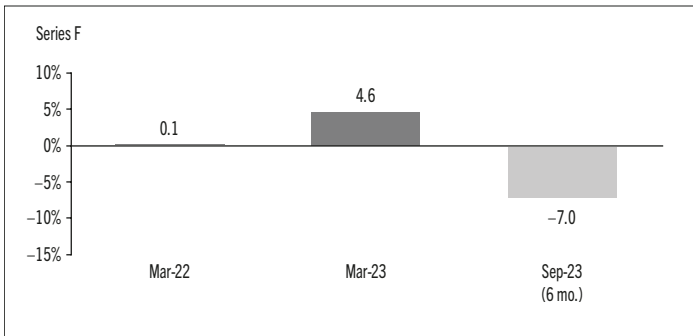
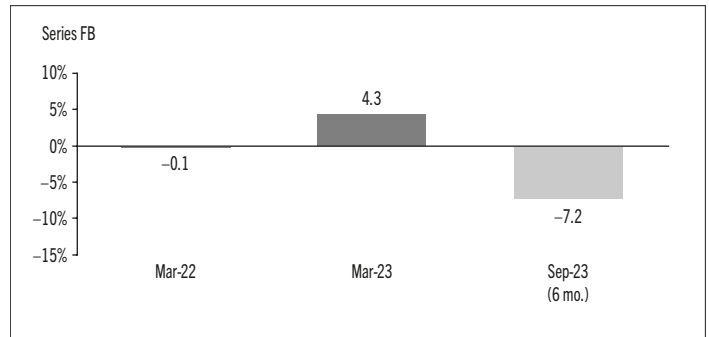
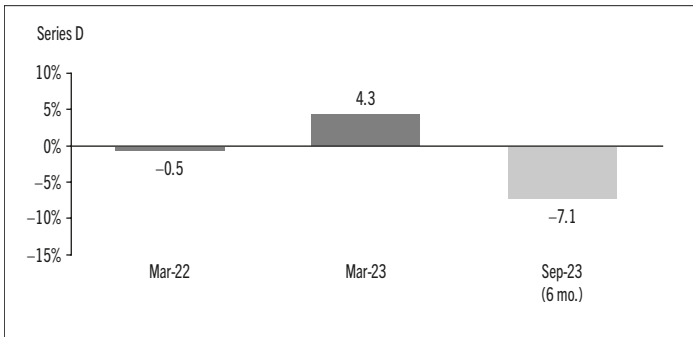
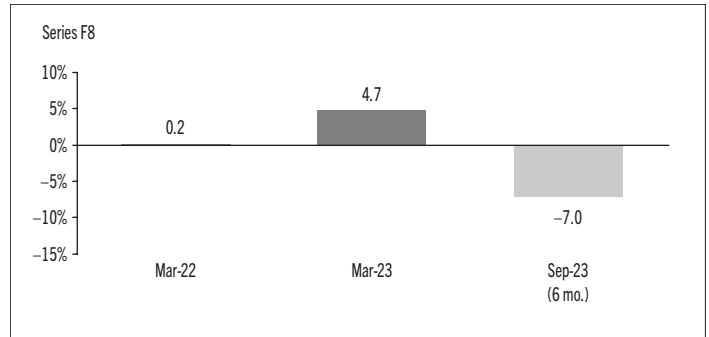
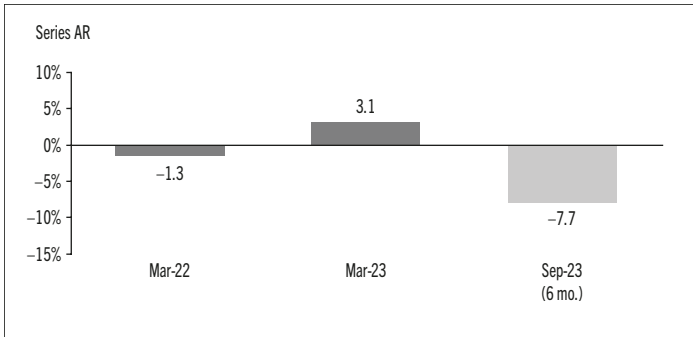
Year-by-Year Returns

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 25% of the total management fees that the Manager received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the period. The Manager is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 33% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.
